Perth College Swimming

Terms and Conditions

Participants in the Perth College Learn to Swim and Swim Squad programs must adhere to Perth College's Terms and Conditions. While onsite at our swimming facility, you must follow all instructions from Perth College staff including those relating to parking, emergency procedures, and entering or exiting the School grounds.

What To Bring

- Bathers, footwear, drink bottle, and towel.
- Goggles and swimming caps are recommended.
- Sunscreen is recommended when using the Perth College pool facility.
- Please bring appropriate warm clothing for after the lesson or training session.
- Medication for medical conditions such as asthma should be brought to each lesson with your child.

Enrolment

- Learn to Swim staff will work with families throughout the enrolment process to determine the appropriate level for each child based on their previous swimming experience.
- Enrolments are made through the booking system, *My Swim Results*. You will need to enrol your child each term through this platform. Once your child has a profile with us and they have been allocated a level, you will be registered to receive all future correspondence regarding enrolments.
- Please inform the Learn to Swim staff, prior to an enrolment or an assessment, if your child has any special needs, including but not limited to behavioural, medical, or learning needs, so we can cater to these requirements.
- When you enrol in the program and receive your lesson time and day, you commit to all sessions for that term without the ability to swap lessons. This includes school-related events such as camps and performances.

Supervision of Children

- Children under the age of 12 are not permitted to enter the pool area without a parent/guardian.
- Regardless of their skill level, no child is completely safe around water and must be supervised at all times.
- Please note that Learn to Swim teachers or Swim Squad coaches are not responsible for your child before or after their lesson. Your
 child must not enter the pool until instructed to by appropriate staff.
- Please take your child to the toilet before their Learn to Swim lesson.

Health and Safety

• You must not bring your child if they are unwell or are suspected to be unwell.

Progress Feedback

- If you have any concerns about your child's progress, behaviour, or emotional state, our Learn to Swim Coordinator or Supervisor will be available to discuss these with you while your child is swimming.
- After the swimming term ends, your child's Learn to Swim teacher will offer a chance for parents to discuss their child's progress following the lesson. Due to limited time with each parent, please consider other swimming families waiting in your child's class.

Learn to Swim Teachers

- All Learn to Swim teachers are fully qualified as AUSTSWIM or Royal Life Saving WA Learn to Swim teachers and hold current Working with Children Cards.
- Our Learn to Swim teachers may change from program to program depending on availability.

Camera and Mobile Phone Use

- The use of cameras and mobile phones in changerooms or toilets is strictly prohibited.
- To ensure privacy is maintained, if you wish to take photos or video of the child in your care, please speak to the Learn to Swim Coordinator or Supervisor first.

Payment and Cancellation of Fees

• All payments are made through the My Swim Results platform and provided to families once term enrolments close. Missed lessons are forfeited, and no credits are offered unless a medical certificate is provided for sickness or injury, or in extenuating circumstances.

Right of Admission

- Perth College reserves the right to refuse admission to any person, to suspend or cancel any enrolment without refund, or to request any person to leave the premises due to inappropriate behaviour.
- Reasons for cancellation or suspension may include failure to comply with these Terms and Conditions or any other reason deemed appropriate.
